# Powerpoint presentation by Sarah on Library resources from the Oakland Public Library (OPL) website.

- 1. For new books, start with the OPL website, go to catalog, then search, then featured lists. Select New Books or CDS, etc. New books with a few older ones to start with are listed in no particular order. Select & scroll here. The list is updated monthly.
- 2. For a 72 hour subscription to the New York Times... Start with OPL page, select online services in the middle. Below this select online research and learning. Finally select

- newspapers and articles. A variety of newspapers and articles are listed. Scroll down to NY Time and click. You will get a 72 hour access code.
- 3. Kanopy offers more than 1,000 film titles and includes Great Courses. You can access 5 films per month. Kanopy is offered thru Overdrive.
- 4. For ebooks and audio books, both Overdrive and Libby are available for free checkouts. You do need to set up an account using your library card. Sarah said Libby is slightly easier to use but Overdrive has a few more options.

## **Dimond Library Friends' Updates: (from Karen Long)**

**Request for a treasurer volunteer** from Friends of the Oakland Public Library (FOPL)- Ronile Lahti from FOPL has asked if anyone is interested in becoming the treasurer for FOPL/ After a little discussion on FOPL, no one expressed interest. Karen will notify them.
