Dimond Library Friends' Updates:

New Leadership in 2023: voting for new officers (President, Secretary & Treasurer).

 Jaeger from the Hillside Garden Club has donated slate rock for the new garden and has
 several volunteers form the club who are interested in developing and maintaining the
 new library garden.
- Keep Oakland Beautiful grant reporting: Karen Long said that she would complete the grant reporting since she had done the original grant application. The report is due by the end of March. There will be an Earth Day celebration & dinner in April for the KOB award winners. Karen will attend and invite the new co-presidents to join her.
- Website support (updating minutes, meetings, donation capability on site, posting
 pictures, etc.) Karen reported that she had asked Michael Dobson, a local computer tech
 for help in updating the website. She asked Michael several months ago for assistance
 but nothing has happened yet. The new presidents said that they would continue to
 work on the upgrade.

Financial Report by Karen Marie Schroeder, Treasurer Karen Marie shared a financial report. The Friends currently have \$56,929.92 in the Bank of America account. She shared the expenditures for library programs (\$3,106) and the donations and funds earned from the ongoing book sale. (\$1146)
